# LAST YEAR'S FATSTOCK RESULTS

The 70th annual Christmas Fatstock Show & Sale organised by the Melton & Belvoir Agricultural Society (MBAS) was held at the Livestock Market last year on Saturday 3rd December.

There was an amazing show of Livestock - Cattle, Sheep, Pigs and Goats; and Produce – Cheese, Pork Pies, Sausages, Pastries, Home Baking, Junior Baking and Preserves, for the judges to consider. Once the judging was complete, winners were awarded their rosettes and prize cards and the Champions were presented their trophies by the Mayor, Cllr Alan Hewson, MBAS President Stephen Hallam and MBAS Chair and CEO of Melton Mowbray Market Hugh Brown.

The whole day was a great success, with the farming community both locally and nationally competing and coming to the auction, where the Livestock sold well for a total of over £200,000. We raised, with your help, the amazing sum of £6825.66 for charity. This is broken down into:

- Mayor's charities: £3605.66 (LOROS Hospice & Dove Cottage Hospices)
- LRSN Lincolnshire Rural Support Network: £1820 (which pays for 4 months of nurse attendance at Market)
- RABI Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institution: £1400

Champion Beast in Show, the biggest prize in the show, was sponsored by Shoby Priory Agricultural Ltd. and won by JB Thompson of Stainby with a 680kg Limousin cross steer grossing £3,500 selling to Kitson's Butchers of Northallerton. The Thompsons were presented with The Brownlow Challenge Cup and a £500 prize. Reserve Champion Beast was sponsored by Bentons and won by C&G Davies of Gaddesby. It was sold to the judge, Chris Hawes of Blue Texel Farm shop, Bicester, a 640kg Limousin Heifer, also grossing £3,500. Champion Lambs in Show were sponsored by Bowring Transport and won by RW Barker of Great Ponton. They were sold for £320 a head to Hill Top Farm Shop, Melton Mowbray, who also took the Royal Agricultural Benevolent Institution (RABI) champion for £300. Sheep sold for the benefit of RABI totalled £1,400. Champion goat was sponsored by the Society and won by David Wadland of Aston le Walls, selling to £140 to PC Amor. Champion pigs, sponsored by the Society, to M&L Fane Livestock, Saxilby, selling to £230 to Billy Burton of Deeping St Nicholas.

The Best Single Stilton Cheese was sponsored by The Stilton Cheese Makers Association and won by Cropwell Bishop Creamery, who were presented with the Easom Bowl. The highly coveted Best Three 454g Melton Mowbray Pork Pie Class was sponsored by Pollock Associates and won again by Leesons Butchers of Oakham, who took home the Lord King of Wartnaby Memorial Cup. The Produce was also auctioned after the presentation of trophies, raising just over £2,500, with proceeds split between the Mayor's charities (LOROS and Dove Cottage Hospices) and MBAS. A separate charity auction of Stilton and Pork Pie was held in the cattle ring, which raised £1,800 for Lincolnshire Rural Support Network (LRSN) and Farming Community Network.

260 guests gathered for the evening's Dinner & Dance, held in the Banqueting Suite of The Stockyard at Melton Market, where the Championship Cups were presented and guests enjoyed a delicious 4-course dinner. A charity auction was held, with prizes ranging from a toy tractor and trailer, to tickets for Glorious Goodwood Racecourse on Ladies Day, which raised just over £1,800, with proceeds going to the Mayor's charities. Other fundraising on the night raised almost £1,000, which will be split between the Mayor's charities and MBAS.

After dinner and the auction, the brilliant local band The Souljers filled the dancefloor late into the night.

# **CONDITIONS OF ENTRY 2023**

# 1) ALL CATTLE ENTERED MUST EITHER COME FROM A TB 4 PARISH OR HAVE BEEN TESTED WITHIN THE LAST 60 DAYS.

- 2) No exhibitor shall have more than three entries in any one class, and no entry shall compete in more than one class.
- 3) If there are not more than four entries in any class, no third prize will be awarded.
- 4) No exhibitor shall take more than two prizes in any one class.
- 5) All animals must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor and to have been in his/her possession prior to 1st November 2023.
- 6) All show cattle must be led with the exception of the commercial classes. Exhibitors must ensure that their cattle have been suitably trained to be led and if, in the opinion of the Society, are not adequately trained, the Society will refuse entry to the show for that particular animal. The Stewards decision is final.
- 7) Cattle Classes 1-7 only are eligible for the Championship.
- 8) Classes 13 and 14 are restricted to a cow, which has had a full-term calf.
- 9) Cattle to be numbered as in entry catalogue and sold in that order, except for the Champion and Reserve Champion Beast, which are to be sold first then 1st, 2nd, and 3rd in each class followed by all other entries in the catalogue order.
- 10) All documents must accompany the entries to the cattle market; animals without documents will not be eligible for judging.
- 11) All animals must be sold through the auction or prizes and prize money may be withheld.
- 12) Melton Mowbray Market Holding Number 22/296/8000.
- 13) Classes open to **Regular Consignors** means that entry is restricted to vendors who have sold prime cattle orsheep (respectively) in Melton Mowbray Market on 4 or more occasions in 2023.
- 14) All animals to be in the Market by 8am on the day of the show. Judging of cattle, sheep, goat and pigs to commence from 9am.
- 15) Lambs must be a minimum of six months old.
- 16) All sheep classes are open to trimmed and untrimmed sheep.
- 17) All cattle, sheep, goats and pigs to be judged on suitability as a butcher's animal apart from ewe lambs, which will be judged on breeding suitability. Young Handlers Sheep Class to be judged on each individual's handling ability throughout the show, including preparation of animals for the Show Ring. The judges may also ask competitors questions based on their showing and livestock knowledge.
- 18) Pig Classes 43-45 are only open to single pigs not shown in other classes. Weight classes may be amalgamated dependant on entries.
- 19) The Judge will cut one Cheese and one Pork Pie in Classes 50, 51, 52, 53, 54, 55 and 56 for inspection.

- 20) All Pork Pies, Preserves, Cheeses, Sausages, Pastries, Home Baking and the Christmas Wreaths will be auctioned for the benefit of the Mayor's Charities and the Society at 2.30pm in the Exhibition Hall.
- 21) Livestock entries must be made on or before Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> November 2023 and Produce entries on or before Friday 24<sup>th</sup> November, and no entries will be allowed after that date.
- 22) Exhibition Hall prize money to be collected on the day of the Show from the Steward. Livestock prize money will be paid out by Melton Mowbray Market. Uncollected prize money will be held by the Society for 14 days following the day of the show, during which time it can be collected by contacting the Secretary. Uncollected prize money after this time will be retained by the Society.
- 23) All objections must be lodged in writing to the Secretary by 11.00am on the day of the show with a fee of £10.00 for each objection, which will be returned if the objection is sustained. Any dispute shall be referred to the Chairman of the Society whose decision shall be final and binding.
- 24) ALL ENTRY FEES MUST BE PAID FOR BEFORE LIVESTOCK IS EXHIBITED, via BACS, Paypal or Cheque to Melton & Belvoir Agricultural Society. Please note all entry fees are to be paid to Melton & Belvoir Agricultural Society, not Melton Mowbray Market.
